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Spectacular Results from President Chang's Visit to Australia

Featuring English-taught courses, dual Masters in Finance in Partnership with Queensland University of Technology

From March 1 to 4, President Flora Chia-I Chang paid an academic visit to Australia, accompanied by Vice President of International Affairs, Wan-chin Tai; Dean of the College of Business and Management, Chien-liang Chiu; and Dean of the College of Engineering, Chii-dong Ho. The purpose of this visit was to participate in the 2016 conference held by Asia-Pacific Association for International Education (APAIE), to get an understanding of international education exhibitions, and to exchange ideas with domestic and international educators. Moreover, President Chang also visited University of Melbourne and sister universities, Queensland University of Technology (QUT) and University of Queensland (UQ). In particular, President of QUT, Dr. Peter Coaldrake, welcomed the visiting group in person, and President Chang cordially invited him to visit Tamkang University on its 66th anniversary.

This visit to Australia achieved spectacular results. Since the sister school partnership between TKU and QUT began in August 2011, mutual exchanges have been actively accelerated. Not only did the two schools conclude the dual-degree agreement, but 7 departments in the College of Business and Management agreed to offer dualdegree programs in October 2015. In 2016, Tamkang University further cooperated with QUT to establish TKU-QUT dual Masters' program in Finance, featuring English-taught courses, and will begin to recruit students in Fall Semester 2016. The two schools will continue to confirm details and arrangements. On the basis of the successful experience offered by the colleges of business, during the visit to QUT, the colleges of engineering in QUT and TKU discussed the possibility for the dual-degree program and international academic cooperation in the future. Besides, on the visit to UQ, the visiting group was warmly received by the Dean of the Business College. The business colleges of TKU and UQ also concluded an agreement that the Department of Information Management

and the Department of Statistics would be included in the dual Masters' program designated in April 2015. Totally, nine departments in the College of Business have cooperative exchanges with our sister university. TKU established a sister school partnership with UQ in December 2007. Currently, the two schools have agreements as Junior Exchange Study Program, English Teaching Workshop, and Dual-Degree Program.(Deng Chiou-Rung)

Tamkang University Moves Forward on Webometrics Rankings of World Universities

Webometrics Rankings of World Universities (WRWU) announced the latest ranking of universities worldwide in January, 2016. Tamkang ranked no. 415 globally, no. 55 in Asia and no. 8 in Taiwan. Tamkang's ranking is on the top of all private universities and is the only private one in the top 500 worldwide.

Compared with the previous year, Tamkang moved forward from no. 478 to 415 globally, no. 80 to 55 in Asia and no. 9 to 8 nationwide. Besides, slight improvement was made in the four indicators. Among which, Impact moved forward from no. 370 to 205, Presence no. 815 to 478 and Openness no. 202 to 154. Only Excellence slipped backward to no. 884 from 877. (Wu Yue-Feng)

Besides, "Futurology provides academic-based solutions to social issues and problems. It is anticipated that the government would bring Taiwan prosperity with futurology," expressed President Chen Dingchuan, Alumni General Association. In the final speech, President Lin Jian-xiang, Alumni Association of Graduate Institutes, said, "Taiwan's economic development is deep-grounded in knowledge and systematic analysis, which is making futures studies indispensible."

Along with the six forums and two workshops, Hames MacGregor, an experienced futurologist, was invited to give a speech on macro-history perspective on current situations in the hope of academic exchanges and further practicing the theories. Expressing his wish, Director Chen Kuo-hua, Graduate Institute of Futures Studies, said, "It has been known that futurology has its origin in the Western world. To counter this tradition, the conference is convened for the purpose of more varieties and more Asian perspectives," and he added, "Futurization is one of Tamkang's educational philosophies and it is anticipated that the alumni would accommodate futurology in industries." The Office of International and Cross-strait Affairs held the Third Tamkang World Forum for Youth Leaders from January 19 to 22, 2016. The theme of the forum was "The Prospects of the World: Meeting Challenge with Vision." Subjects for discussion included "global economy," "world peace," "global environment and globalization," "global culture and society," and "global government and democracy."

In Chueh-sheng International Conference Hall and Ching-sheng International Conference Hall, on January 19 and 20, 2016, students from 13 different universities and

countries, including 26 students from Tamkang University, presented their papers and participated in discussion. Vice President of International Affairs, Dr. Wan-chin Tai, said in his opening remarks, "This Forum provides a venue for students from different universities to exchange ideas on the trend of global development and discuss diverse issues, so as to enhance students' critical thinking of globalization."

Yohei Osada, from Josai University, Japan, focused on the rise of tourism and the increase in the number of cross-border workers and exchange students, proposing that in order to achieve economic growth, international economic exchanges can be promoted by improving citizens' English ability.

Ya-ting Yu, from the Department of International Business, Tamkang University (TKU), presented a paper on "imitation of economic behavior." Taking India and Japan as examples, Yu indicated that the government must take relevant considerations into account before adopting other nations' successful policies and analyzing model policies for future use.

Linda Eggert, from Oxford University, UK, gave a presentation

titled "Remedial Responsibility, Uncertainty and Moral Luck in Just War Theory." Eggert aimed to complicate just war theory by bringing morality and the uncertainty of cognition into consideration and, in so doing, Eggert further explicated that with regard to an individual's remedial responsibility for his just war conduct, it is a challenge to religious discipline.

In addition to introducing the history of Kazakhs being admitted to membership in the UN, Aida Akhmetova, from Eurasian National University, Kazakhstan, made a comparative analysis of UN member states. Also, Aida elaborated the reasons for Kazakhstan to be a non-permanent member of the United Nations Security Council. (Deng Chiou-Rung)

Experts in Diplomacy and Higher Education, Concourse of Wisdom in Tamkang

The College of Foreign Languages and Literature opened a special seminar on "Diplomatic Practices" in Spring Semester, 2016. Experienced professionals and scholars in the field of diplomacy were invited to lecture on Taiwan's diplomatic relations along with their practical experience. Students were greatly interested in selecting this course and the quota was exceeded with 175 students being enrolled.

This course was hosted by the Chair of the Department of Spanish, Dr. Sheng-bin Lin. Several senior diplomats were invited to give a lecture, including Mr. Ming-wen Wang (the former Ambassador in Nicaragua), Mr. Michel Ching-long Lu (the former Director of Bureau de Representation de Taipei en France), Mr. Ren-yow Huang (the former counselor of Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Canada), and Mr. Jhy-wey Shieh (the former Director of Taipeh Vertretung in der Bundesrepublik Deutschland). Dr. Sheng-bin Lin said, "Through lecturers" work-based experience, students will learn about practical diplomacy, related knowledge, and interpretation skills and broaden their horizons. Meanwhile, students are also encouraged to find a government job, which is a good option for future career." Another new course, "Seminar on College Education and Teaching," was opened in The Doctoral Program of Educational Leadership and Technology Management, the College of Education. The Dean of the College of Education, Dr. Dian-fu Chang, indicated, "The course focuses on the sharing of practical experience. The former Minister of Education, Dr. Ching-je Wu, would share his experience with education policy making and promotion, and scholars would elaborate on their concept of education. In this way, doctoral students could have a better

5 8 % Graduates Meet Work Demands

Survey on Satisfaction and Employment Overview, 103rd (102nd) Academic Year by Office of Alumni Services and Resources Development (OASRD) had a response rate of 64.2% and indicated significant results. The survey had an additional factor, Influence of Eight Literacies on Graduates, which invited positive feedback from graduates. The top 3 were Team Spirit, Independent Thinking and Ethics. Executive Director Peng Chun-yang, Alumni Association, further elaborated, "The Eight Literacies are the foundation of school management guidelines. From which, it is anticipated that coordinated efforts of students and faculty members may lead

to optimal results in synergy and job hunting."

The survey, based on a 6-subscale Likert Scale, reported that Proud of Being Tamkang Graduates got the highest points, 4.75. The following were Willing to Donate to Tamkang in Any Forms and Willing to Endorse for Tamkang, respectively 4.65 and 4.46. Besides, 10.4 % were willing to receive relevant information from OASRD, among which Tamkang Times E-paper was the majority.

In the Employment Overview, 54.6 % of graduates had already been employed 1 year after graduation and a majority of the unemployed were in a master's or PhD program. 83.8 % of the graduates served in private enterprises, among

which over half were in financing, marketing and business management. For the employed (including in-office programs), the monthly incomes ranged anywhere between 25,000 and 34,000 NT dollars, 31,900 NT dollars for undergraduates; 48,800 NT dollars for master's program graduates; and 56,300 NT dollars for PhD program graduates.
