President Chang: "The Ke Nan Hill is like a living archive."

"Founding and Foresight--University Archive Exhibition 2016" started on August 5 and would run till October 31 at Chuan Lyu Exhibition Hall, Gallery of NTU History. This project was part of the workshop activities for archive administration supervisors, which the Ministry of Education (MOE) has held for many years, and was organized by National Taiwan University (NTU), inviting 56 public and private universities to take part. The opening ceremony was graced with the presence of the President of NTU, Dr. Pan-Chyr Yang, the President of Tamkang University (TKU), Dr. Flora Chia-I Chang, the first President of National Tainan Junior College of Nursing, Dr. Hsin-Hsin Chung, Director-general of the National Archive Administration of the National Development Council, Chiu-Yen Lin, and Director of the Department of Secretarial Affairs of MOE, Yi-Shun Zhou.

In his opening remark, Dr. Pan-Chyr Yang pointed out that NTU has held archive exhibitions for many years and he felt delighted that 56 universities could join this great project. As the representative for private universities, President Flora Chia-I Chang stated that TKU was founded in 1950, the first private university established by Taiwanese people, and that the compilation of TKU history was completed six years ago with photographs and documents archived. President Chang further indicated that archive processing testified to the idea that archives were heritage and could tell stories, triggering alumni's memory. The Ke Nan Hill climb which used to be the only pathway to the campus is indeed the best case in point, with every freshman student nowadays beginning their college life by climbing up the 132-step stone staircase, a tradition indelibly inscribed on alumni's hearts.

The exhibition was organized into six themes: the university journey, the cultural landscape, the university founding spirit, file pioneering, inspirational instructors, and outstanding foresight. The exhibited materials from participant universities included valuable documents, school badges,

campuses made of blocks, campus landscapes, and architecture such as the Chinese palace-style classrooms and University Commons of TKU. In particular, historical reports from the Tamkang Weekly (now the Tamkang Times) on exhibit vividly demonstrated TKU's excellent tradition built

Celebrating Tamkang's 66th Anniversary - Beam-Raising Ceremony for Shou-Chien, to be Completed in February 2017

At 9 o'clock on the morning of September 3, the Office of General Affairs held "the beam-raising ceremony for the construction of Shou-Chien International Conference Hall." The rite was cohosted by President Flora Chia-I Chang and Vice President of Sun-Sea Construction Corporation, Mr. Hung-Chang Chiu, and three Vice Presidents of TKU as well as first-level and second-level directors all attended the rite, offering incense and praying. Finally, the hosts raised beam reinforcement and, during fireworks, prayed for successful completion of the construction. President Chang remarked that the construction of Shou-Chien International Conference Hall had extraordinary meanings. Alumna Hang-Jian Hsu donated 120 million NTD for the construction of the International Conference Hall being named after his parents, Shou-Chien and Yo-Lian. This was the first time that alumni raised money to construct a building for alma mater since the founding of TKU. The TKU triple objectives of education would be incorporated into the software and hardware facilities of this newly constructed building, which in turn would be a significant venue for alumni's cohesion. The construction went smoothly and was estimated to be completely by February 2017. With regards to the fund-raising, alumni offered financial support for the large, middle-size conference rooms. Hopefully, more alumni could join the project "one person, one brick." We hoped the construction would continue smoothly and provide TKU with new space for transformation and development. Great Recruitment of Students Tamkang Has

The statistics by Registration Section, Office of Academic Affairs, revealed that freshmen's registration rate reached 96.85%. Above which, the Chemistry Department and the Department of Diplomacy and International Relations (English-Taught Program) even had a rate of 100%. Zheng Dongwen, Dean of Academic Affairs, expressed his gratitude toward the faculty and staff members, saying, "Low birth rate has an unprecedented impact on higher education. There are fewer students to be enrolled. Without efforts of yours, Tamkang couldn't have this achievement in recruitment."

Besides, the recruitment of international students also had good results. The statistics by Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs (OICSA) revealed that Tamkang had enrolled 634 first-year international students and 150 exchange students in 105th academic year. To be exact, there were 2,072 foreign students across all levels. To help foreign students integrate into school life, International and Mainland Students Guidance Section organized a welcome party in the Student Activity Center on September 26th. Tai Wan-chin, Vice President for International Affairs attended the party, and he further had Tamkang introduced to the 350 new students. TKU Placed 448th Globally in the Webometrics Rankings of World Universities, Computer Science and Information making the top 500 of QS Rankings for the first time

The up-to-date Webometrics Rankings of World Universities (WRWU) was released in July 2016. Tamkang University was placed 448th globally, 72nd in Asia, 7th in Taiwan, as the No. 1 private university in Taiwan and the only private university in Taiwan that entered the world top 500 universities.

Compared to the result presented by WRWU in January 2016, the ranking of TKU in Taiwan has improved from 8 to 7. Among the four indicators, "Presence Rank" vastly improved from 478 to 31, while "Impact Rank" regressed

from 205 to 254, "Openness Rank" from 154 to 599, and "Excellence Rank" from 884 to 984.

Since 2004, Webometrics Rankings of World Universities has been published by Cybermetrics Lab (a research group of the Spanish National Research Council) every six months, providing information about the academic ranking of Higher Education Institutions. According to the website of WRWU (www.webometrics. info), the composite indicator for the rankings is based on the database of institutions worldwide as well as other web search engines and

independent information providers, such as Google Scholar, Ahrefs and Majestic. In January and July each year, the rankings will be updated according to their web presence and impact.

On September 5, QS World University Rankings was published by Quacquarelli Symonds (QS). Tamkang University made the top 500 for the first time, with the subject Computer Science and Information in the field of Engineering and Technology positioned between 401 and 500. (Chiou-Rung Deng)

Zhou Lin is the ambassador and executive director of Council of Non-Governmental Organization of International Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs (ROC). He is also an alumnus of the Graduate Institute of European Studies. His experiences in dealing with international affairs had made him Deputy Director of Department of Central and South American Affairs, Deputy Representative in Portugal, and Ambassador in the Republic of Panama. His determined and refined temperament made his sharing of 30-something years in foreign affairs quite blissful. After all those years, what Zhou could not leave behind was his invaluable memory of Tamkang University. Besides, the language training in the Department of Spanish built a very solid foundation in Zhou's language competence.

"As a diplomat, I speak for and behave for my country. A single small mistake might very likely cause misunderstandings or even worse, sabotage diplomatic ties." In the time when he was in the position of an ambassador, Zhou advanced his horizons and got the diploma of Ph.D of History, Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile. Even now, he still worked very

What best characterizes a competent diplomat are proficiency in a foreign language and classic wording." The job of a diplomat was arduous but still enchanting. As a result, a diplomat's first job is to have Taiwan

Tamkang University Blazes Its Trail into Times Higher Education Ranking

Tamkang University was ranked in the bracket of no. 801 to 980, a ranking of world universities done by Times Higher Education (THE), 2016~2017. The ranking report involved universities from 79 countries. It was Tamkang's first time to get into this ranking, along with other 25 universities in Taiwan. Together with QS (Quacquarelli Symonds), Times Higher Education started their collaboration in the ranking of world universities in 2004. Then in 2010 they began publishing reports independently in world higher education each year. According to THE official website (https://www.timeshighereducation.com/), the report was based on the quality in teaching and learning environment, academic research, and citations and reputation. All of these are sub-indicators of pedagogy, knowledge transfer and globalization found in world-renowned universities.
